LIGHT UP CHICHESTER EVENT - NEW FORMAT FOR 2024

Chichester BID, in partnership with Chichester City Council, is presenting **'Light Up Chichester'**, a reimagined **Christmas Lights Switch On event** taking place on **Saturday 23rd November 2024**. This year's festivities will be a day filled with family-friendly fun, live performances and festive celebrations, ending in the brandnew Light Up Chichester: The Afterparty, to carry the magic late into the evening.

Daytime Festivities


From 1100, Chichester's city centre will come alive with festive activity. Visitors can enjoy live music, street entertainment, a light show, <u>a snow machine transforming</u> <u>the streets into a winter wonderland</u>, and interactive activities for families. Other highlights include the popular Starlight Trail at The Novium Museum and Pallant House Gallery, where children and families can create their own paper lanterns. There will be a **pop-up food market** on East Street offering seasonal delights from local vendors. The cast of Chichester Festival Theatre's Cinderella will lead the **countdown to the Christmas Lights Switch On at 5.00pm** outside The Assembly Rooms in North Street. The Rotary Club of Chichester's Tree of Goodwill will also light up. The traditional blessing of the tree by the Dean of Chichester will take place on Sunday 24th November.

Light Up Chichester: The Afterparty

For the first time, the festive fun continues after the lights are switched on! Light Up Chichester: The Afterparty will see restaurants, pubs, and bars across the city offering themed events, festive menus, live music, and Christmas cocktails **from 5pm until late.** Highlights include Victorian drinks at The Havana, live Christmas music at The Eastgate Inn, meet Elsa and Anna at The Chantry, festive singalongs at The Chichester Inn, and DJ sets at The Vestry.

CHRISTMAS TREE STROLL

Starting on **Saturday 23rd November** there will be a spectacular Christmas Tree Stroll within Chichester. Visitors can discover beautifully decorated Christmas trees located around Chichester city centre, with a special highlight of six unique Christmas tree sculptures created by local artists using sustainable materials. To donate or collect paint, you must book an appointment to visit a Recycling Centre in advance.



HONEST JACK SHEPPARD – HIGHWAYMAN OF THE PEOPLE

On 16th November 1724, a young thief turned infamous jailbreaker, John 'Jack' Sheppard's criminal escapades resulted in his death by execution. However, his legend lived on for many years. His life of crime was cut short. But his skill in slipping out of the authority's grasp made him a hero among the working classes. His story was retold in popular books and plays long after his public execution aged just 22.



Jack was born in 1702 in Spitalfields. In 1717, he became an apprentice carpenter but in 1722 with just one year left of his apprenticeship, Jack met a woman known as Edgworth Bess in the Black Lion Inn, and fell into a life of crime. He was arrested for the first time in February 1724 after committing burglaries with his lover Bess and his brother Tom. He was sent to the parish roundhouse of St Giles-in-the-Fields, but escaped by breaking a hole through the ceiling, climbing on the roof and using a rope made of bedclothes. His second prison escape was from New Prison in Clerkenwell the following May, when he and Bess scaled a 7.6 metre wall with a rope also made from knotted sheets.

Sheppard activities of burglary and highway robbery caught the attention of infamous vigilante Jonathan Wild, the 'Thief-Taker

General'. Wild secured Sheppard's third arrest on 23 July. He was condemned to death at the Old Bailey criminal courts and sent to Newgate Prison. Again Jack managed to escape, not once, but twice. When he was arrested for the final time on 31 October for burgling a pawn shop on Drury Lane, he had prison guards watching him day and night. His prison escapades had earned him celebrity status. While at Newgate awaiting his execution, Sheppard

welcomed many visitors who paid a fee to the guards to meet him. On 16 November, Sheppard was taken to be publicly hanged at the Tyburn Gallows. He had planned one more escape, but his pen-knife, intended to cut the ropes binding him on the way to the gallows, was found by a prison warder shortly before he left Newgate for the last time. He was hanged in front of a huge crowd, said to number 200,000. After hanging for the prescribed 15 minutes, his body was cut down. The crowd pressed forward to stop his body from being removed for dissection, but their actions stopped his friends from implementing a plan to take his body to a doctor in an attempt to revive him.

He remained a working class hero long after his death in 1724. His story was adapted for the stage almost immediately. *Harlequin*



Sheppard, a pantomime, opened at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, on 28th November, only two weeks after Sheppard's hanging! His story was published in pamphlets, ballads and plays well into the 19th century. In the 1850 booklets about Sheppard were still being read aloud to young people in low lodging houses. The authorities attempted to ban the plays and publications, fearing their popularity would encourage a crime wave. Perhaps the most prominent play based on Sheppard's life is John Gay's *The Beggar's Opera*, written in 1728. Sheppard was the inspiration for the character Captain Macheath , whose nemesis Peachum is based on Jonathan Wild the 'Thief Taker General'. The play was spectacularly popular and was produced regularly for more than 100 years.

His story was revived three times as a movie in the 20th century, the last being *Where's Jack?* in 1969, with Tommy Steele in the title role. He has even made it into the 21st century in a novel by Jordy Rosenberg, which tells the story of a 21st-century academic who discovers a manuscript containing Sheppard's "confessions", which documents his childhood and his love affair with Edgeworth Bess!
